THE COLLEGE

The sprawling campus is spread over an area of 1.74.98 hectares in sylvan surrounding that blesses it with an unmatched serenity. Affiliated to Himachal Pradesh University Shimla, the college is imparting education to rural youth in different disciplines like Humanities and Commerce at under graduate level.
